AUGUST 6 & 7, 2011

**30/50 & 25/50 Miles Plus a Trail Ride
Multi-Day Ride in Cascade, Idaho**

Directions: From I-84, take the Eagle Road Exit 46 and go North to the town of Eagle (about 6 miles). Turn East on Hwy 44 for approximately 2 miles. Turn North on Hwy 55, heading towards Cascade. Approximately 3/4 of a mile past mile marker 109, turn East on Corral Creek Road for 1 mile; then turn North for 1.5 miles to ride camp—or just follow the migration of the Flamingos to Ride Camp.

Ridecamp: Ride camp is a beautiful meadow on *private land* with plenty of room for big and small rigs. Horse water provided, please bring people water. Dogs are welcome, on a leash. Certified weed-free hay is required. Manure will have to be bagged.

Trails: Gorgeous FORESTED trails, MORE two tracks and some cross-country with lots of live water. Excellent footing—hardly any rock. Barefoot friendly. If you are lucky, you might even see a rare wild Forest Pink Flamingo! This is a mountain ride—ride smart & ride both days—any distance, any horse and a special 2-day award.

Vetting: Pre-ride vetting will start about 4pm Friday, August 5th. Our Head Vet will be Dr. Robert Washington, DVM; second vet will be Dr. Keith Ruble, DVM; and our third vet TBA. We are going to try to keep all vet checks in camp.

Ride Meeting: Ride meeting will be Friday evening, August 5th around 7pm.

Start Times: 50's start at 6:00am, 30's start at 7:30am. Trail Riders can start any time after 9am.

Entry Fees: Save money and pre-register! Full refunds given. **AFTER JULY 23th—entry fees are \$100.** 50 miles—\$85; 25/30 miles—\$85; Juniors \$10 discount; 2011 AERC Ride Managers \$20 discount—limit 1; Trail Ride—\$25. A \$15 Day-Member Fee will be added for all non-AERC members with the exception of Trail Riders (please present 2011 AERC card at Registration or we have to collect the \$15). Extra catered dinner tickets for Friday & Saturday evenings are \$10 each (after July 23rd—\$15/each). Awards: Awesome awards will be presented Saturday & Sunday evenings about 6:30pm. **Ride both days—any horse—any distance and win a special 2-day award.** Other awards given to the “Best Dressed” Pink Flamingo—your horse, your camp, or you (winners by rider vote), *Best Condition awarded thru 3rd place*, Multi-Day Riders, Tail-Enders, Mid-Packers, and Over-All'ers,

Other Activities: There is plenty of fishing/boating close-by at Horsethief and Corral Creek Reservoir, Cascade Lake, and the Payette River. Tons of trails for mountain biking & hiking, too.
